DESIGN:

Easthopes were known for their simple design and long life. The inboard motor had a shaft and propeller, and a clutch with forward, neutral and reverse.

HISTORY:

In 1913 the Easthope brothers of Vancouver began building two and four-cycle marine engines from 3-18 horsepower. Easthopes are the most famous marine engines on the west coast during the first half of the 20th century. The Easthope Engine was used extensively by fishing fleets.

TIDBIT:

The four-cycles used less gas, ran smoother, and were fast and reliable. Between 1913-1961 the Easthope company built 6,000 engines.
