Named the "John Salisbury"  
Cedar strip  
14' long by 48" beam, 90 lbs  
Carries three: one oarsman  
and two passengers, strictly  
non-powered, although a  
small spritsail is often used for  
down-wind use.

### BUILDERS:

Rick Crook and his  
boatbuilding students. Built to  
lines taken from the Hubert  
Evans' Handliner in the  
Sunshine Coast Museum &  
Archives in Gibsons.

### HISTORY:

This boat design was very  
common in the Strait of  
Georgia around the 1930's,  
used to fish for salmon off the  
beach in a subsistence fishery.

### TIDBIT:

**Hubert Evans**  
was a respected  
Canadian author  
whose fishing  
supported his  
family and  
enabled them to  
survive the  
Great  
Depression.
