- is within the Pender Harbour area
- has historical, archival and/or information value
- includes but is not limited to: objects, documents, digital material, records, photographs, films, machine readable magnetic and optic media, published and unpublished manuscripts, maps, plans, sound recordings

A case-by-case approach is used regarding Aboriginal material. Aboriginal human remains, burial objects and sacred and ceremonial objects are passed to tems swiya Museum.
